- Xiaolei Fan CHEN10092 – Make frequent effective use of Announcements to highlight key information to students.
- Carlos Avendano CHEN30061&64211– Provide students with the options for anonymous posting in discussion boards – students have make extensive use of the tools and tutor also provides feedback
- Martin Gillie MACE10010&11001 – used discussion boards to help students develop knowledge and understanding.
- Fiona Saunders MACE44011&60023 – Used discussion boards for two way communication and allow students to support each others queries.

How Blog and Journals have been used

- Vicky Coker EART10262 - Used weekly blogs as part of students assessment. Students developed reflective writing skills and engaged more in the learning space.
- Paul Cowell MATS30170 – Uses Journal for students to create e-Logs of their experience on the course. Student are distance learners and make effective use of the communication tools, creating multimedia content in there journals.
- Teaching for Researchers – The cross Faculty programme use the Blackboard Blog tools to assess students and also allow students to consolidate their thoughts with this tool throughout the course.

How groups have been used

- Colin Webb CHEN30012&30022&30032 – Have create group sets to put students into project groups. Students have there own shared groups work area where they can exchange files, create wikis and blogs have hold group discussions.
- Neil Mitchell EART20271 – Used the group tool to assign students to Lab groups – student would attend a lab session as assigned with their groups and then additional content and Blackboard tests would be releases to each lab groups according.
- New Academics Programme – Uses the group tool with new cohorts. Content is release using adaptive release setting to cohort groups and smart view are enabled in the grade centre to easily mark students work.

- Jonathan Sly – FOUND10072 incorporated a Facebook page in his course. Students could discuss and collaborate on here as part of their course.



- Paul Chan MACE30462 – used live Twitter feeds in lectures and encourage students to interact.



- Delia Vazquez MATS30151 – display the staff Twitter feeds within the Blackboard space to increase communication options and encourage engagement with real world professionals and opportunities.

- Chris Blanford MATS64591 – is using Poll everywhere with students for in class polling and used a similar approach in 2015/16.

Communication & Collaboration Tools

Tools that can be used to support teaching and learning

Express ideas & Share posts

Share thoughts, reflect on topics and post comments with online noticeboard, Blogs and bookmarking tools.

Many of these tools allow for collaboration with shared working areas to contribute and edit content.



Networking & Discussion tools

Discussion tools can provide feedback and revision materials as well as challenge ideas.

Students can learn from others - students, staff and professionals in their field.

A community of practice can be created and students can lead their own learning.



Manage Posts

Stay organised with post and communications you send out across your communication channels



Video Call

Hold meetings, discussions and classes without being in the same room.

Video calling can bring together both small and large groups depending on the tool used.

Your broadcasts can be recorded and shared with students for revision aids.

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
